# Introduction



### What we've covered so far

• "In a world where **fallen image-bearers** of God fight for safety and dominance, our **anxieties** about life in the world induce within us traditional views about purifying and protecting our own people, and these priorities appear to be addressed by leaders who fit the strongman image. As demonstrated by biblical history, these innate fears, moral intuitions, and impressions—which are based on imperfect information—pose a serious challenge to our humanity and faith, leading us to idolize tyranny in our societies and churches. Yet we are blessed with a hopeful portrait of leadership through Jesus Christ that transforms our understanding of both leadership and followership and redeems our moral character, interpersonal relationships, and church governance."



### One step does not necessitate the next

- 1. Leaders are a product of our needs and wants, including our moral intuitions
- 2. Some people prioritize the protection of social order, hierarchy, and purity
- 3. We judge leaders imperfectly due to limited information and distance
- 4. We draw from traits that appear to signal effective leadership: for tyranny, domineering, pushy, manipulative, loud, conceited, selfish
- 5. Acceptance of tyrannical traits perpetuate support for authoritarian rule
- The solution is a redemptive lens on creation

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



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## **Behavioural immune system**



- The **behavioural immune system** (BIS) is understood to have developed to avoid threat from disease, and since other humans are a source of pathogens, the BIS is likely to affect social attitudes.
- BIS reactivity is related to collective beliefs, avoidance of casual sex, preference for long-term mating, and conformity to other people's opinions.

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## **Mortality salience**



- Mortality salience and terror management theory suggest that awareness of death activates the instinct for self-preservation. People cling to something meaningful that will live on, often something that validates their worldview standards or self-esteem.
- Awareness of one's mortality is associated with people who become more prejudiced, stereotype people negatively, punish social deviants, desire more children, and have reduced desire for an attractive woman (for men).

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## **Historical disease prevalence**



- Historical disease prevalence (HDP) is the past incidence of disease shown by epidemiological maps. Supposedly people respond psychologically to the risk of infection by changing their social behaviours.
- Higher HDP is related to populations that are: less extroverted, less open to experience, and less liberal in their sexuality; more xenophobic, more ethnocentric, and more politically oppressive.
- Higher HDP is also associated with lower individualism, higher collectivism, and higher traditional or binding moral foundations.



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## **Belief in a dangerous world**

- 1. It seems that every year there are fewer and fewer truly respectable people, and more and more persons with no morals at all who threaten everyone else
- 2. Although it may *appear* that things are constantly getting more dangerous and chaotic, it really is **not** so. Every era has its problems, and a person's chances of living a safe, untroubled life are better today than ever before
- 3. If society keeps degenerating the way it has been lately, it's liable to collapse like a rotten log and everything will be in chaos
- 4. Our society is **not** full of immoral and degenerate people who prey on decent people. News reports of such cases are grossly exaggerated and misleading
- 5. The "end" is **not** near. People who think that earthquakes, wars and famines mean God might be about to destroy the world are being foolish
- 6. There are many dangerous people in our society who will attack someone out of pure meanness, for no reason at all







## **Belief in a dangerous world**

- 7. Despite what one hears about "crime in the street", there probably is not any more now than there ever has been
- 8. Any day now, chaos and anarchy could erupt around us. All the signs are pointing to it.
- 9. If a person takes a few sensible precautions, nothing bad will happen to him. We do **not** live in a dangerous world
- 10. Every day, as our society becomes more lawless, a person's chances of being robbed, assaulted, and even murdered go up and up
- 11. Things are getting so bad, even a decent, law-abiding person who takes sensible precautions can still become a victim of violence and crime
- 12.Our country is **not** falling apart or rotting from within

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









## **Fearmongering in churches**

• "Driscoll thrived on manufacturing a sense of threat posed by outsiders ... A sense of physical threat dovetailed with religious and cultural hazards: unorthodox theology, Islam, "sexualized single women" and "effeminate men" all put the church and nation at risk. Driscoll incited fear in order to maintain control. Tolerating no passive consumption, he demanded self-sacrificial service and absolute submission to (his) authority. As in wartime, dissent was quickly snuffed out. By ratcheting up the sense of alarm, Driscoll justified his demands for discipline, control, and unquestioned power."






## **Questions to ask**
